






The spirit of the Bosco Brotherhood is felt the minute one sets foot on campus. Our students are engaged, polite and well-rounded young men who show genuine concern for their peers. Bosco alumni benefit from lifelong friendships with their Bosco Brothers, sharing a true sense of pride for their campus and each other.

NATIONALLY RECOGNIZED ATHLETICS St. John Bosco High School competes in the Trinity League, recognized as the most competitive league in California. Bosco offers 13 CIF-sponsored sports comprised of 40 separate teams, plus two club sports. Nearly 80 percent of our student population participates in one or more of our sports, and eight of our 13 CIF-sponsored sports are "non-cut," giving all students an opportunity to participate.



Located in Bellflower and close to several major freeways, Bosco's beautiful 36-acre campus is accessible to students from the South Bay to Orange County, Long Beach to the Inland Empire. Bosco also offers bus transportation from various locations throughout Southern California.



**FAITH-BASED EDUCATION** Our educational approach is grounded in Christ's example and the innovative teachings of St. John Bosco, a 19th century Italian priest and educator, St. John Bosco believed that reason, religion, and loving kindness are essential to forming the whole person. Each day, the faculty, counselors, administration, and coaches at St. John Bosco High School embody this philosophy.



Bosco graduates enter and excel at colleges across the nation. 96% of our seniors are accepted to a 4-year college or university, including admission to 22 of U.S. News & World Report's top 25 national schools. Bosco alumni are currently studying at Brown, Princeton, Stanford, MIT, Dartmouth, all UC and CSU campuses, and the US Military, Air Force, and Naval Academies.





### **SCHOOL PROFILE**

St. John Bosco High School is an all-male private college preparatory high school in Bellflower, California, with a current enrollment of 850 students. Rooted in the philosophies of Don Bosco, our founder, we practice a tradition of innovation and embrace the world's ever changing landscape to form our young men into faith filled leaders, scholars, and honest citizens. We celebrate each student's unique background, talents, and character by facilitating learning through collaboration, communication, and critical thinking.

**OUR MISSION** is to form men of purpose focused on faith, intellect, leadership and citizenship. While the majority of Bosco students and faculty are Catholic, many world religions are represented in the school. We embrace diversity and promote tolerance, global concern, love and understanding among all students, parents, teachers, administrators, and alumni.

As a Salesian college preparatory school, SJB is a Home that welcomes, a Church that strengthens faith, a School that fosters intellect and reason, and a Playground where brothers celebrate life.

**OUR FACULTY AND STAFF** consists of 104 men and women, most of whom hold advanced professional degrees. All faculty and staff engage in ongoing professional development.

**OUR COUNSELING AND GUIDANCE TEAM** is made up of four full-time, credentialed counselors who are trained and committed to each student's growth, success, and college readiness.

stressed at Bosco. Students are challenged to achieve excellence in the classroom, on the athletic field, and in extracurricular activities.

### **ALL-BOYS EDUCATION**

For nearly 80 years, Bosco has been a leader in all-male college preparatory education in Southern California.

Our faculty use teaching strategies that address learning styles specific to boys. St. John Bosco's Oratory Model of "Home, School, Church, Playground", coupled with the all-male educational environment, creates a unique place where our students can truly be themselves.

Bosco's teachers, coaches, and counselors form meaningful relationships with their students.

### **ACADEMIC PATHWAYS**

Students who enter an Academic Pathway participate in four years of discipline-specific learning experiences that mirror a college major. Pathway students benefit from advanced level coursework, internships, field work, co-curricular competitions and capstone projects, and have opportunities to network with partner organizations. Through articulation agreements with various community colleges, Pathway students may earn college credit for their coursework. Upon graduation from Bosco, students earn a special diploma and transcript.



#### **BIOMEDICAL PATHWAY**

The Biomedical Pathway is designed for students who excel in mathematics and natural sciences and are interested in the fields of biology or medicine. In addition to intensive classroom instruction in advanced mathematics, health sciences, physical sciences, and chemical and biological sciences, students gain clinical knowledge by working with professionals in hospitals. Students also conduct research and attend lectures provided by physicians, research scientists, and medical professionals. Students participate in internships

### COMPUTER SCIENCE PATHWAY The Computer Science Pathway,

based on the nationally recognized "Project Lead The Way" curriculum, allows students to become creators, not just consumers, of the technology that surrounds them. Computer Science students enjoy an advanced coding curriculum and collaborative projects, in turn gaining problem-solving, critical and creative thinking, and communication skills. Students learn a broad range of topics including coding, artificial intelligence,

### **ENGINEERING PATHWAY**

The Engineering Pathway has adopted the nationally recognized "Project Lead The Way" curriculum, which offers an innovative Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics (STEM) program. In their courses, students learn and apply the design process, develop collaboration and communication skills, and hone their critical-thinking and problem-solving abilities. Students who complete the Engineering Pathway will be prepared to complete a post-secondary education and pursue careers in science, technology, engineering, or mathematics. Students have the opportunity to participate in a summer internship with Pelican Products.

### ENTREPRENEURSHIP PATHWAY Bosco has partnered with the

University of Pennsylvania's Wharton School of Business to create an innovative four year interdisciplinary program designed to prepare students for collegiate business degree programs. Students learn analytical thinking, decision making, and logical reasoning while researching current business trends and the skills and techniques necessary to launch and manage successful business ventures. Students participate in the Project ECHO competition through UCLA.
